Troop Money Earning Activity Budget Form**

All troop money-earning activities must be approved by **both** the Service Unit Director and the Council Service Center **at least 30 days prior** to the proposed start date of the money-earning event or activity. All Shagbark Council Policies and Standards must be met, as well as, Girl Scouts of the USA guidelines as stated in the Blue Book and Safety-Wise.

Approved Money Earning Activities – any item that *girls make* can be sold to raise funds, such as bake sales and craft sales and any service that *girls provide* can be offered to raise funds, such as car washes and gift-wrapping services.

Non-Approved Money Earning Activities – the sale or promotion of any item, or product, or service **NOT** made or created directly by the girls.
